Dear Friends,

I'm grateful for our church and our growing excitement about serving our community. That excitement is clear to me in great traditions like Vacation Bible School and the golf tournament/picnic; it's also clear in our willingness to take risks and try new things like our Pig Roast or Fourth of July community service at the gazebo. We continue our monthly Sunday evening communion celebration, too, with some great offerings in the months to come. Thanks for being a part of it all. And as you enjoy these events, don't forget to bring a friend!

Several of you have shared how an article I published last year was helpful for you, so I include it again (slightly edited) for your reference:

The Apostle Paul worked constantly to teach the meaning of following Christ and of our calling to make him known. He wrote to the church in Ephesus,

"[Christ] is the one who gave these gifts to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastor and teachers. Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work, who are to build up the church, the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4:11-12 NLT).

Paul is saying that all God's people are the ministers of Christ. All of us share in the calling to build up the church so that we can make Jesus known to the world.

What about the pastor? My job is to coach each of you for your particular callings so that we may come to "unity in our faith and knowledge of God's Son, mature and full grown in the Lord, measuring up to the full stature of Christ" (4:13). In light of that, I'd like to help you understand my ministry as pastor, and how I can be of help to you personally. Here are some of the main ways I shepherd the flock at Christ Presbyterian Church.

Preaching

The most important way I pastor our church is through preaching God's Word truthfully and in a way that connects to the mission of God and the real lives of the congregation. I preach about 45 times a year and occasionally share the pulpit with other preachers as well. Preaching is not inspirational talk, advice-giving or moralizing, but empowering people with the good news about Jesus and calling them to decision. I spend over twenty hours a week preparing for Sunday morning, and specifically, for the "preaching event." If you miss a sermon, you can download a sermon from our website, read the text online, or pick up a copy of the manuscript on the information table in the Fellowship Hall.

Teaching

My sermons include solid teaching to build up the family of God, but of course, time is limited. I also teach in other venues around the church, such as my Pastor's Bible Study. I regularly teach both the Session and Deacons. I have taught Men's and Women's Studies, Confirmation class, New Members, and occasional adult education series. I also teach frequently in other settings in our church, such as in staff meetings or small groups. The purpose is that we might grow up in the knowledge of God and discover God's will for us.

Counseling

I appreciate the opportunity to get to know people in a deeper way and to help them grow in Christ. I'm available for pastoral counseling, and meet with people every week. If you would like an appointment with me, please contact our church secretary Jessica, either by phone or by email.

Emergency Pastoral Needs

If you have an emergency need, please call me any time. Although I appreciate that church members don't call me at home for regular church business, feel free to call my cell phone in an emergency (805) 637-5213. If you need pastoral support, call the church office during business hours or leave a message there.

Hospital Visitation

I, along with our deacons, am committed to caring for people in times of hospitalization. I share these visits with them as we become aware of needs. If you know you are going to be in the hospital, please call Jessica in the office, let me know, or contact a deacon.

Writing

Along with my regular preaching and teaching, I expand my ministry in our church through articles in our monthly newsletter. My articles are my reflections on Christian practice, and are a place for me to share my heart with you. You can pick up a newsletter in the church narthex on the first Sunday of the month.

In addition, I have written a book, *From Rebellion to Redemption: a Journey through the Great Themes of Christian Faith.* This lays out what we believe, and brings in a library's worth of readings from other voices in our tradition. A second manuscript is a devotional commentary on the book of Romans. I have also contributed devotional and curriculum resources for *Christianity To-day Press* and other publishers. You can get more information on these works in the church office.


Prayer

One of the most important ministries of the pastor is to pray for the church. I regularly pray for our congregation, asking for God's leading, and for its leaders, and for those the Lord calls to mind. No positive change is possible without a deep and growing connection to God in prayer, as we learn what he is calling us to and equipping us for.

Miscellaneous

As a pastor, I am a member of Presbytery, and so have responsibilities for committee and general work there. I work regularly with several committees of our church, which usually meet in the evening, and actively supervise nine staff members. I am working on a second doctorate, which requires me to study, write, and occasionally teach. This keeps me fresh as I continue to learn. Lastly, I serve our community and beyond by conducting weddings and funeral services as invited.

My regular office days are Monday through Wednesday, with Thursday being sermon preparation day and Friday as my day off. If you have any questions about my ministry, or our church, or theology, or anything else, feel free to contact me. Study leave for Pastor is to be reported in advance to the Session. Session may question the suitability of the study content as to its value to CPC.

Revised Policy for Pastor Sunday Worship Preaching Schedule:

Pastor is expected to preach every Sunday of the year, except for the following:

One month vacation (currently four Sundays)

Two weeks continuing education (currently two weeks)

Four church related Sundays (to include the following):

- Guest speakers even though the Pastor participates in the worship service
- Pulpit exchange
- Preaching at other churches
- Visiting other churches
- Tres Dias weekend retreat as Spiritual Director
- Participating in CPC national or international mission trips
- Other CPC business such as teaching a Sunday school class

Outreach

This month, I want to continue building on the theme that I started in this article last month:"Living into other people's lives."

At the end of August, CPC will be hosting our 2nd annual "Pig Roast" out on our own front lawn. This event is specifically designed to allow us, as a church, to live into other people's lives. It is an event designed to allow us to engage our surrounding community, regardless of our abilities to do certain tasks or to commit certain amounts of time. We are, of course, asking for people to volunteer to cook burgers, serve pork, set-up and to clean up afterward. If you can't do any of that or, even if you're volunteering in one of those ways, there is something just as important that needs done. We need *YOU* to show up!


Part of "Living into other people's lives" is the idea of simply being *present*. The whole idea of the Pig Roast is sharing a meal with the rest of our community. It is a fine and necessary thing to provide service but, as most of the men who go to the City Mission, the real heart-work happens in the personal interaction that happens most easily while eating together.

This will involve inviting, perhaps *bringing*, our friends, neighbors, co-workers and even our families – especially those who would not normally darken the doors of a church, and then being intentional to just be around them. It will also involve being aware of those who don't come with someone from our church family and being willing to step out of our normal groups and cliques to make them feel welcome, to engage them in conversation, to live into their lives.

It is important to remember that the Pig Roast is an event designed to allow us to *demon-strate* God's love to our community by both serving and sharing in life, to do outreach. The idea is to engage people in a way that makes them wonder about what makes us tick. For those of us concerned that people hear the message along with seeing it in action, there will be subtle *declarations* of God's love (evangelism) in the music performed and opportunities will hopefully arise, naturally, through the conversations we have. Also, everyone in attendance will be invited to come and hear Pastor Randy proclaim God's love at a special evening service in the pavilion.

None of us should feel nervous about how to act or what to say. As Christians, we have the Spirit of the Lord living within us; we have the Power of God to accomplish the tasks, to have the conversations, which He brings our way. We won't need to force conversations in a spiritual direction, or worry if they don't go that way, if we trust that seeds can be planted in silence and that it is the Father who makes them grow!

(Next month, we'll begin a series on the differences between *outreach* and *evangelism* and how they both contribute to *missional living*.)




We have an opportunity to help low-income children with school supplies for the upcoming school year. Our community is sponsoring a "Help Me Learn" day.
